Autumn term

Aim:
 To develop the interpretation and performance of a monologue. To introduce students to the theatrical staging mediums such set design, direction sound and lights.

Aims:
 Using multiple drama texts to develop to prepare the students improvisation skills using mediums and elements and explorative strategies required by the exam. Develop student's ability to read and interpret text and creative response to these.
