From the Headteacher

Dear parents and carers,

I was really pleased to note that John Francis, editor of 'The Comet', reads our newsletter! Without any prompting from us, he referred, in his editorial comment on page 5, to the four Nobelians who have been received conditional offers from Oxford and Cambridge colleges. This emphasises how significant this is for Stevenage not just our lovely school – needless to say, I dropped John a line thanking him for reading 'Nobel News' and celebrating our good news across the town.

On a slightly different note, we were delighted and quite moved to receive a letter earlier this week from Garreth Evans, a Nobelian between 2001-2006:-

'Dear Nobel School,

In 2006, I would have never believed anyone who told me, this is how the next decade would turn out. During my time at the Nobel school I was often in and out of trouble, in fact I was fortunate not to be expelled. As a young teenager I struggled with dyslexia, dyspraxia and ADHD, academically I was very poor. However down to some self-belief, supportive teachers, hard studying before my exams I was able to get my 5 Cs including mathematics, English and science. When I look back this was a huge turning point in the lives of so many people in my year. Achieving this goal was life changing; I went to college, then university for a BSc in sport science, was able to travel the world working with world class athletes, went back university to get a MSC in nursing working in critical care and I'm now in the process of going back to university and joining the army where I intend to study Medicine and go to Sandhurst (RMAS) to become a medical cadet.

The point is, anything is possible! You just need to try really hard and believe in yourself because the next couple of years will define you as people.

If possible I would like to share my story with some students, I hope it can possibly give them the belief they can aspire to be anything they wish'.

I do hope that our students will read Garreth's letter and feel inspired to work hard and apply themselves, especially our year 11 who only have 12 more school weeks before the GCSE examination season starts. Furthermore, we would love to hear about the careers and successes of other Nobelians. 



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
