

16-19 Bursary

Independent Study



- To achieve they must be committed to independently studying for a minimum of 16 hours/week outside school
- Study periods are on their timetable- they can work in the library, 6th Form Study area or the dining area
- Study time should be used to complete work set and for wider reading around subjects
- Lessons: PLT: independent study 1:1:1
- BYOD policy (Bring your own device)

Plagiarism

Plagiarism refers to taking the work or an idea of someone else and passing it off as your own work. It includes:

- Copying and pasting directly from the internet without citing and referencing.
- Copying from books, journals, newspapers, magazines without citing or referencing.
- Paraphrasing by changing a few words, for example using a thesaurus.
- Copying a friend's work because they forgot to do their homework.

Consequences of plagiarism

- If a teacher identifies plagiarism the student will be asked to redo it and resubmit work
- If the examination board identify in work submitted to them that it has been plagiarised they have the power to give the student zero marks for the coursework, withdraw them from the qualification or even withdraw them from all qualifications that they are taking with that examination board.
- At University it can lead to a student being thrown off their course.

What will we do if we suspect plagiarism?

- Speak to the student and refer them to the session at the start of the year. We will let parents know by phone. The student will be allowed to re-submit the work by a given date. The plagiarism must have been addressed
- 2. We will ask parents to attend a meeting to discuss the plagiarism. The student will be given re-submission date
- 3. The Director of Faculty with the Head of Year will issue a written warning notifying the student that a further incident of plagiarism will result in failure of that Unit and therefore failure of the course. Resubmission date will be agreed

Home Study Agreement
