



The Nobel School Review of Marking

Centre assessed marks (GCSE controlled assessments, GCE coursework, GCE and GCSE non-examination assessments)

The Nobel School is committed to ensuring that whenever its staff mark candidates' work this is done fairly, consistently and in accordance with the awarding body's specification and subject-specific associated documents. Candidates' work will be marked by staff who have appropriate knowledge, understanding and skill, and who have been trained in this activity.

The Nobel School is committed to ensuring that work produced by candidates is authenticated in line with the requirements of the awarding body. Where a number of subject teachers are involved in marking candidates' work, internal moderation and standardisation will ensure consistency of marking.

Any concerns about the procedures in assessing these assessments should initially be raised with the teacher concerned and/or Head of Department. It is hoped that this will resolve the matter. If the disagreement cannot be resolved by discussion between the teacher and candidate concerned then the candidate may appeal to the Head Teacher via the Exams Officer. Any appeals must be made in writing to Miss Crow before 4th May 2020

1. We will ensure that candidates are informed of their centre assessed marks so that they may request a review of the centre's marking before marks are submitted to the awarding body.
2. We will allow sufficient time for the review to be carried out, to make any necessary changes to marks and to inform the candidate of the outcome, all before the awarding body's deadline.
3. We will ensure that the review of marking is carried out by an assessor who has appropriate competence, has had no previous involvement in the assessment of that candidate and has no personal interest in the review.
4. We will instruct the reviewer to ensure that the candidate's mark is consistent with the standard set by the centre.
5. The candidate will be informed in writing of the outcome of the review of the centre's marking.
6. A charge of £40 will be incurred for a review of marking to cover the cost of the review process and the administration. This will be reimbursed if there is a change in marking outcome.

After candidates' work has been internally assessed, it is moderated by the awarding body to ensure consistency in marking between centres. The moderation process may lead to mark changes. This process is outside the control of The Nobel School and is not covered by this procedure.
