Key Assessment Activity: G351: A performance / presentation of part of one of the recital pieces. G352: Harmony exercises throughout the course. G353: Ongoing contextual research, listening test at the end of the half term.	G354: Performance 2 Aims: To write programme notes for the recital, keep a listening and practice log, and to research the pieces and composers in your recital. G355: Composition 2 Aims: To investigate typical textures and harmonic sequences for Bach chorale writing, and to have completed at least two exercises, to have written a brief for the composition, and outlined the sections, keys and textures that will be used. G356: Historical and Analytical Studies in Music Aims: To work through practice listening questions for six vocal pieces, followed by an analysis of the extracts chosen, to complete an analysis of each song from the 3 set works, to have looked at how each set work fits into the styles and sounds of each period. Key Assessment Activity: G351: Ongoing feedback on the recital programme notes, a performance of all pieces from the recital (in part or in full). G352: Harmony exercises throughout the course, plus at least two full exercises completed, outline of the sections, keys and textures to be handed in at the end of the half term for feedback. G353: Ongoing contextual research, listening test at the end of the half term.

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Aims:

To work through past paper questions for vocal music, followed by full analysis of the pieces used, to analyse songs from the related repertoire for each topic, with contextual comparisons with songs from the set works.

Key Assessment Activity:

G351: Ongoing feedback on the recital programme notes, a performance of all pieces from the recital (in part or in full) up until the exam.

G352: At least two full exercises completed (one in a minor key), first draft of the composition taken in to be assessed against the exam criteria.

G353: Essay questions on each of the set works.

Aims:

To use essay questions to guide the revision and research required by the students.

Key Assessment Activity:

G351: Ongoing feedback on the recital programme notes, a performance of all pieces from the recital (in part or in full) up until the exam.

G352: Regular feedback and guidance on the controlled assessment throughout the half term.

G353: Essay questions each week, with home study based on the students work.
