What will I learn on this course?

This course will enable you to:

- develop your interest in, and enjoyment of, a wide range of theatre and drama;
- encourage your knowledge, and understanding, of the social and cultural contexts of drama and theatre;
- develop your ability to respond sensitively and critically to a range of drama texts and live theatre;
- appreciate different styles of drama and approaches to theatre;
- acquire a range of practical theatre skills and develop appropriate production and drama and theatre studies performance techniques.

- enjoy reading and exploring ideas, issues and plays in a practical way, as well as through individual study and essay writing;
- co-operate well with others in a creative, disciplined manner;

- · enjoy performing and devising drama;
- enjoy studying a subject which is relevant to their own lives and experiences.

Course Structure

The subject content for A-level Drama and Theatre is divided into three components:

- 1. Drama and theatre
- 2. Creating original drama
- 3. Making theatre

Assessments

Component 1: Drama and theatre

Knowledge and understanding of drama and theatre by:

- Study of two set plays,
- Analysis and evaluation of the work of live theatre makers

Written exam: 3 hours, Open book . 80 marks - 40% of A-level

Component 2: Creating original drama (practical)

Process of creating devised drama by:

- Performance of devised drama. Devised piece must be influenced by the work and methodologies of one prescribed practitioner
- Working notebook (40 marks)
- Devised performance (20 marks)

60 marks in total - 30% of A-level This component is marked by teachers and moderated by AQA.

Component 3: Making theatre (practical)

Process for presenting drama by

- Practical exploration and interpretation of three extracts (Extract 1, 2 and 3) each taken from a different play
- Methodology of a prescribed practitioner must be applied to Extract 3
- Extract 3 is to be performed as a final assessed piece
- Reflective report analysing and evaluating theatrical interpretation of all three extracts

Performance of Extract 3 (40 marks) Reflective report (20 marks)

60 marks in total - 30% of A-level - This component is marked by AQA.
